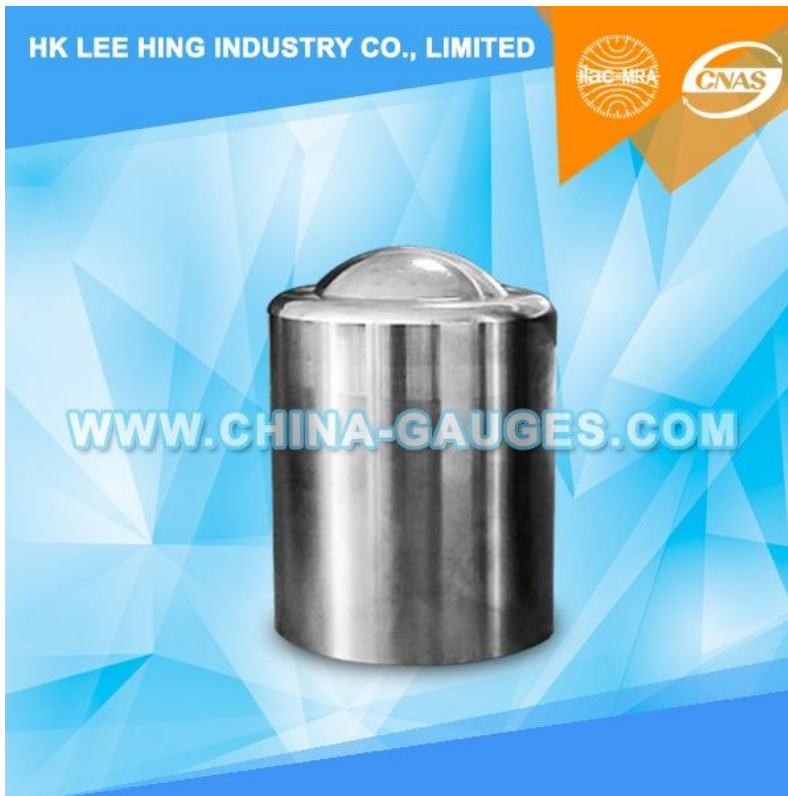


## 5J Striking Element Hammers

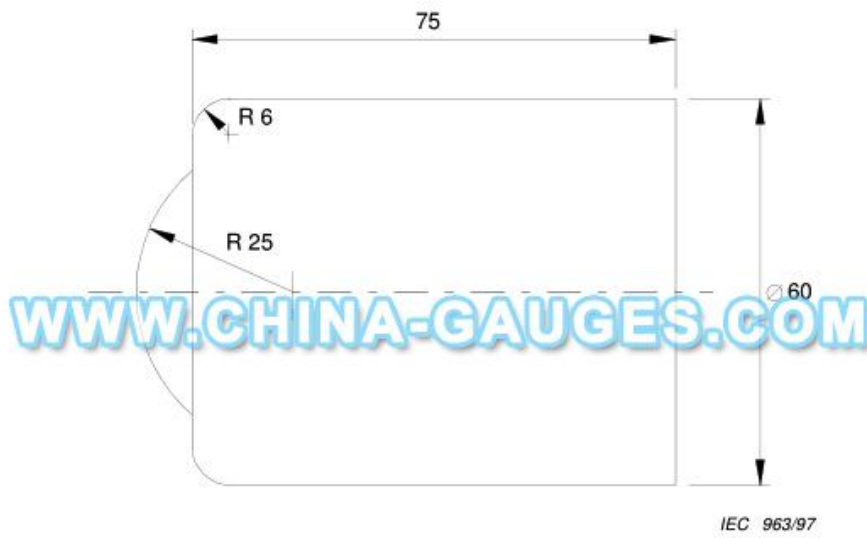
